Mental Health First Aid

Dare County now has two individuals trained to provide the Youth Mental Health First Aid curriculum. The Breaking Through Task Force, in collaboration with Dare County Department of Health & Human Services, sought out scholarships for two team members to become trainers. Currently, the course is available for little to no cost to any individual who lives or works with young people. The first class was hosted in November and had approximately 15 participants.

Breaking Through Task Force Public Awareness Campaign

The Breaking Through Task Force received a Community Benefit Grant for Mental Health Public Awareness Initiatives. The Task Force created 4 video PSAs on the following topics: stigma & language, mental health champions, mental health and the Breaking Through Task Force.

Substance Abuse CHIP Progress

Saving Lives Response Team

In Spring of 2019, the Saving Lives Response Team pilot project expanded to provide services to all of Dare County. Within 24 to 72 hours after a reported opioid overdose, an outreach worker from Saving Lives Response Team attempts a face to face contact with the overdose survivor and provides a naloxone kit, overdose prevention training, and links to services. In addition to responding to overdoses, individuals can call the response team and request assistance in navigating treatment options. The outreach worker will meet with individuals, assist with paper-work, and provide transportation to treatment if necessary.

Saving Lives Task Force: Public Awareness & Education Campaign

A weekend Family Systems Workshop provided professionals, family members and loved ones with skills and tools necessary to begin or help others through the healing process and develop resiliency. The program material covered: the disease of addiction, boundaries, codependency, family systems, experiential therapy exercises and process groups. Professionals who attended the weekend event were provided 10 free professional continuing education credits. This workshop was made possible by The Blanchard Institute, Saving Lives Task Force, Holland & Associates Counseling.

G.R.E.A.T. program

The G.R.E.A.T. (Gang Resistance Education and Training) Program is a national and international gang and violence prevention program that was developed by The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency and The U.S. State Department / International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs almost 30 years ago. This program has been shown to build trust between law enforcement officers and their communities by teaching elementary and middle school students the GREAT curricula (in the classroom). The curricula is designed to teach the students life skills that direct them away from delinquency, youth violence, and gang membership. It is designed for children that are at the prime age for introduction to gangs and delinquent behavior.

Pill Disposal Bags & Drop Boxes

All pharmacies in Dare County have free pill disposal bags available upon request. The initiative began in September 2019. CVS Pharmacies in Manteo and Kill Devil Hills and Walgreens in Kill Devil Hills have also installed drop boxes.
